Welcome back! We hope you've had a restful Easter Break. The children have worked really hard so far, and we look forward to seeing some more amazing work this term. The following information gives an outline of our planned work for the summer term.

English

Writing – The Children will be using the text 'Floodland' as their stimulus to write in a range of genres such as persuasive speeches, narratives and informal letters.

Reading – We expect children to read daily at home and at school. Home reading can be recorded in their Sherwood School diary. In school, they will take part in whole class and group reading sessions. The children will have the opportunity to visit the school library and they also have access to the class reading corner where they can choose books.



Maths - The children will be revising all areas of maths in preparation for their National Curriculum Assessments (previously known as SATs) which will take place in the week beginning 11.5.26.

Science - This term we will be focusing on light and investigating how it travels and reflects. We will also be using our scientific enquiry skills to conduct fair tests into how shadows form and how we see light.

Computing - The children will be following the 'Purple Mash' scheme of work and learning about Internet safety. The children will use computing lessons to learn about computer networks and creating quizzes.



Humanities - This term we will be focusing on 'Turning Points in History'. The children will deepen their knowledge and understanding of important events in British History.



ART & D.T – The children will create a range of art work around the theme 'Going Places' and for DT they will be taking part in a cross-curricular project which will involve creating a product, marketing campaign and a presentation to a panel of experts.



PSHE - We use the Jigsaw programme to learn about keeping safe and making positive choices

R.E. - Children will be learning about the Faith and how the arts is impacted through this.



PE - Children will need to wear their PE kit to school on the days they have PE. Lessons will take place outside, weather permitting. PE sessions will be taught by PE specialists and class teachers.

French - The children will have French lessons once a week. They will learn vocabulary linked to going to the Café

Music – Music lessons are taught by specialist musicians from Merton Music Foundation.

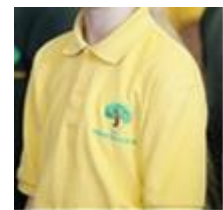
A spelling test will take place every Thursday.
